Music by Leonard Bernstein, lyrics by Stephen Sondheim. Starring Natalie Wood, George Chakiris, and Richard Beymer. Inspired by Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, the story is set in the mid-1950s in the Upper West Side. Two gangs battle for control of the turf—a situation complicated when a gang member falls in love with a rival's sister.

Nominated for eleven Academy Awards (the most for 2023). Starring Michelle Yeoh, Stephanie Hsu, and Jamie Lee Curtis. In this hilarious and big-hearted sci-fi action adventure, an exhausted middle-aged Chinese American woman (who cannot seem to finish her taxes) is swept up into an insane adventure in which she alone can save existence by exploring other universes and connecting with the lives she could have led.
